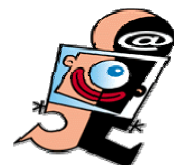

Introduction



Our member organizations have various modes of operation and of participation. Some are federations or local associations or youth centers whose target audience is only young, others are aimed at a wider audience whose majority is young. We estimate the "young" population under 26 years who adheres directly to our member associations and/or who are involved at least in a local club or project to more than 370000.

For associations whose target audience is the youngsters only, they are involved at all levels and in all instances. Some members have binding legislation imposing a quota of young people in any instance of decisions, some not. For other members, youth participation is not institutionalized as such, but continued attention is observed for the renewal and rejuvenation of the decision-making bodies

Generally in all member associations, youth are involved at intermediate levels: youth councils, committees set up to develop projects and other participatory models in place within their organizations. Some are also sent mandated to formal internal bodies (general assembly, commissions, etc.) or external, communal councils, provincial or places of guidance for policy decision concerning youth activities.

In the Brussels activities of Contact-2103 and in some local members associations, a space of listening exists for non-organized youth invited to get involved in local projects or in citizens dynamics, often in disadvantaged neighborhoods. This is for some young people a first step towards a more formal membership. In other cases, a support may be proposed for their structuring with a kind of sponsorship: creating their own association like "junior association" in France, eg.



The hereafter presentation of the activities is a summary: we grouped close or similar actions. Activities are sorted according to categories proposed by the European Commission. For each category, we cite the names of the country of the members associations concerned: it may be that your association is or not listed in error in certain types of activities: in this case please reply by telling it so we can correct these data's. You can also send us info about key activities if they are not cited in the document. Thank you in advance

The activities will directly affect many young people and youth stakeholders and indirectly local communities: associations, schools, policy makers and others. The multipliers effects and impact of activities are enhanced by the diversity of structures of our members and partners and by working with public bodies, schools and municipalities.

Half of our members are members for over 10 years; some became new members because they were beneficiaries of activities or training that we organized. Into the member's organizations, the "Europe" dimension is increasing: more participants, more projects officers "Europe" or "International".

Other trends: we work more upstream for the development of projects, and we work more on strategies for long or medium term (Youth Democracy, Action 4.6, Leonardo etc.).

A growing interest exists for the recognition of skills acquired, and Europass, Youthpass etc.

Activities are listed in 8 categories

1. Representation of the views and interests of young people in their diversity at European level

- ◆ Awareness, motivation and support of youth participation to take part at local and European level in briefings or training courses organized by youth councils, by the European Youth Forum, to "youth" events or other forums.
- ◆ Participation in national or regional bodies and other places to orient decision-making policies "youth", European mobility and international recognition of the voluntary sector, policies for the disadvantaged youngsters, the training etc..
- ◆ Participation in platforms of the structured dialogue for Youth and in selection committees of the youth in action program at the national or regional level.
- ◆ Establishment in 2011 of an awareness campaign on volunteerism in the youth field.
- ◆ Setting up at Brussels of study visits and welcome of European delegations from various countries. The programs of these visits are mainly aimed at raising awareness into the EU institutions and to meet European decision makers or European platforms.
- ◆ Participation in the European Civic Forum activities.
- ◆ Last part of the project "Path to Democracy", carried out by an MJC and a Hungarian association: assessment and balance of this "Youth Democracy" project in progress since 2008.
- ◆ A dynamic type "Ambassadors" of European Capitals for Youth will be implemented from Rotterdam, which was European Youth Capital 2008, with the objective of facilitating the establishment at Turin and Antwerp of a year of European Capital of Youth in 2011 and 2012.

European Voluntary Service and other volunteer activities

Sending and hosting of young volunteers as part of YIAP**. Over 55 young people will be sent and about 65 will be hosted in 2011 in a diversity of projects: cultural, social, civil protection, science and technology, web, environment etc.

Sending and hosting of young volunteers in other programs: 5-10

Youth Exchanges

We consider hereafter initiatives in which at least one member association is actively involved. About two thirds of the exchanges are multilateral; the others are bilateral or trilateral, including twinning activities. At least one itinerant youth exchange is announced in Bulgaria and Romania.

Member associations of France, Belgium and Romania are the most involved in youth exchanges. There are also Latvia, Italy and Spain; Portugal is characterized by a specific activity focused on mixing young public socially disadvantaged and young disabled.

- ⇒ Setting up of two activities of international solidarity with the SSA (Sub-Saharan Africa)

3 Non-formal and informal learning and activity programs targeted at young people

Vocational learning courses

Our network will allow a minimum of 140 trainees and youth workers registered in a training to participate in practical internships of individual training for periods varying from 4 to 12 weeks, in or starting from Germany, Belgium, Estonia, Italy, France, Romania, Spain, Netherlands, Great Britain, Greece and Turkey etc.

The internships take place mainly in the framework of Leonardo, but also funded by national programs for the training of young people who left school earlier or who are unemployed. The fields are: training in youth work, early childhood, educators, jobs such as hotels, restaurants etc.

Their action at the local level will also educate to their own reality the target audiences with which they conduct their internship.

The biggest Member organization's promoters in this process are Italy and Germany.

Integration through work

Organization starting from Cologne of class of inclusion for young people without vocational training contract: International courses of youth development with support from the European Social Fund

Bilateral and cross-border training

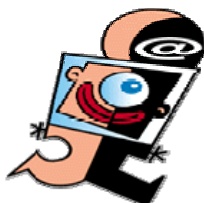
- ◆ Pursuit of a bilateral working action research around the international training for youth workers or Directors of Youth Center
After conducting a comparative inventory of their respective training, follow-up by the setting-up of bi-national training modules. Main goal is to install a cross-border module on the topic of youth work in both countries, with the possibility to valorize the skills acquired by participants. Interreg project.
Partners Belgium, France
- ◆ Continuation of bilateral cooperation in training of associative volunteers for MJC and Hungarian Civil Houses with the aim of providing tools to better understand the associative management, local participatory democracy, relations with institutional partners etc.
Partners: France, Hungary

Long Live Learning, exchange of practices

- ◆ Setting up of meetings, forums and networking for relays in charge of international youth activities at local, regional or national level. Providing information, European youth review, debates about youth issues in Europe, thoughts, sharing of good practices, mutual encouragement, development of communications tools, projects, etc..
Partners involved: Belgium, France, Estonia, Romania
- ◆ Edition in 2011 and transfer to the network of a tool used by all members of Contact-2103 highlighting and valorizing the work of the training group, including inter alia the collective experience on the preparation and implementation of training modules set up in Romania and Estonia.

Local or regional initiatives

- ◆ The Province of Sevilla (Esp) pursues a distance training for youth workers in rural areas: setting up of training sessions in youth work called "From the experience" in remote part. Internet networking, training in basic computer and setting up activities with a European dimension.
- ◆ Continuation of work started in 2010 at the initiative of SVR (Netherlands) about the training of volunteers active at the local level, exchange of experiences, valorization of their commitments. The objective is to enable a quality commitment of new volunteers and new association leaders, youth or adults. Using the Grundtvig program.
- ◆ In January at Paris, the second phase of the seminar "20 years later! "On the topic of the voluntary commitment of young people and the promotion of democracy



Seminars and Training into the YIAP

- ◆ Setting up from 8 to 11/11/11 in Lyon (FR) of a Contact-2103 meeting open also to a few non member associations in order to conduct a reflection and an evaluation aiming firstly to lead a discussion aiming at staying in connection with the evolving youth and secondly to identify what we are willing to develop collectively in terms of training, Life Long Learning and recognition skills.



Training seminar in Estonia, July 2010

- ◆ Setting up (May) of a seminar in Budapest "Framework, Quality, and Impact of Learning Mobility of Young People in Europe" for an audience of National Agencies, Researchers, Developers of youth mobility projects, policymakers engaged in the field of mobility young people in particular from the perspective of non-formal and informal learning. The "Steering Committee" includes 3 NA (National Agencies) - Jugend für Europa, Mobilitas and the Netherlands + Belgium (Contact-2103) and Poland UK + experts and researchers. We participate in work preparation and in the setting up of the seminar in Budapest. Based on a 20 years constructive dialogue in Germany, the wish is to drive sustainable cooperation in some form of informal network that could start at the seminar. The seminar will allow to share good practices and to discuss about the factors of quality and types of mobility programs for youth that contribute to educational and non-formal learning.
- ◆ Training seminar for professional facilitators or volunteer in charge of youth groups on "TOOLS FOR INTERCULTURAL DIALOGUE DRAMA" in Buzau, Romania
The training will provide an opportunity for participants to learn techniques based on theater.
- ◆ Training "TOGETHER TO GET THERE" on the subject of key skills in youth work, in Buzau, Romania
- ◆ Feasibility Visit organized in Morvan (France) with 6 countries (Greece, Spain, Lithuania, Bulgaria, Hungary and France) for a future youth exchange "Myths and legends in Europe" - (Independent of the Project of the Guadalquivir cited above)
- ◆ Training "ADVENTURESHIP" for professional facilitators or volunteer in charge of youth groups: the theme of the training will be "adventure sports" as a tool for integrating youth. In Macedonia.
- ◆ Training ACTIVE LIFE STYLE INTERVENTION ". Netherlands
- ◆ Seminar in Serbia for young people wishing to create or in process of creation of a local association. Some of the young participants have performed a EVS and at their return have wanted to create an association like their hosting organisation. The purpose of the meeting is to try to give them the tools and advice and put in place the means to be able to monitor these efforts.

- ◆ Evaluation seminar of 5 years of practice of youth exchanges and other international projects at Laon for international promoters, with the aim to assess progress, the changes noted, the impact level of commitment Young and strategic developments of each other.

- ◆ Organization of a contact making seminar to bring together potential partners for European projects.
Promoter: Belgium
- ◆ Training seminar on the theme of intercultural dialogue and non-formal education
Promoter: Italy

4 Promoting intercultural learning and understanding

In general and in all the member organizations, promoting learning and intercultural understanding is a permanent priority in all youth international activities that are developed: EVS, youth exchanges, seminars etc. The main tools are role plays, debates, visits to local institutions, collective creations, the use of non verbal communication tools (music, graffiti, arts etc.). Etc...

Meetings, networking, internships

- ◆ Monumental art camp in Poiana Pinului Romania, with the aim at developing tolerance, intercultural learning and religions. This involves comparing religions by making icons by using the "thin" technology.
- ◆ A bilateral student's exchange project will be initiated aiming at involving students from both countries in a volunteer project allowing them thinking and reacting on that kind of commitment. The project will take place in Rotterdam and Cologne with perhaps a final phase in Brussels.
Partners: Netherlands, Germany, Belgium
- ◆ Several exchanges of one week between groups of students in youth work
Partners: Germany, France
- ◆ Putting in relation of youth leaders volunteer and professional of two associations: after a first contact in 2010, wish to go forward and to boost international activities and the bilateral relation between an Italian national network and the CMJCF. Steps are planned for 2011 such as study visits enabling youth stakeholders to know and understand each other with the ambition to develop an action plan involving youth for 2012 and as possible youth associations from small villages. It could also be a kind of sponsoring of a new Italian association Arci (5000 local associations affiliated) to a membership to the Contact-2103 network.

- ◆ Continuation of a Grundtvig project to prevent gender discrimination and to allow exchanges on European best practices in this area
Promoter: Italy
- ◆ Organization of two international meetings "Discover France" in the framework of a French Foreign Ministry call, one on a cultural approach of France, the other oriented around a photo festival, each times about 20 youngsters from all the world will be selected by the Ministry
Promoter: France
- ◆ Coordination of intercultural aperitifs for volunteers and European trainees in Leonardo and other European programs to chat on all topics related to Europe. The approach helps also a better inclusion into the local community and to present European mobility opportunities.
Promoter: Italy

Linguistic approach

- ◆ Setting up of languages "releasing" sessions or learning courses in a formal or non-formal way. Responding to long-running practice in local associations or to overcome difficulties in understanding met during exchanges or seminars, setting up of language courses supported by volunteers or in a more formal way.
Promoters: France, Germany, Netherlands, Latvia, Italy
- ◆ Setting up of European evenings of languages (English, Spanish, German and Polish) for young people, other members and foreign guests, often residing in the Region. Important success: language learning, exhibition, presentation tools.
Promoter: France

Participation in networks

- ◆ Partnership with "Avancer PLUS", a network for vocational schools to facilitate exchanges between France and Germany.
- ◆ Partnership with the network "MOTION (Move Together in Europe for Guidance)" - internships abroad for teachers and trainers.



5 Debate on European matters, EU policies or youth policies

- ◆ Representatives or delegates of member associations of Contact-2103 are present as much as possible and permanently in several spaces of decision making or thinking to orient policy "youths", education, bridges between formal and non-formal education, the education for citizenship, inclusions policies etc.. To prepare the participation of representatives in these spaces, debates are led and structured into Youth Committee or Youth Councils of our members, into their Board of Directors, committees etc..
To our knowledge, these representations are structured in Belgium, Estonia, France, Greece, Hungary, Romania, and less formal in other countries
- ◆ Each year, among other events, about the celebrations of Europe Days, several associations network members are invited to lead discussions, to talk about European mobility, to explain what is EVS etc.. We have to date for 2011 as detailed information for Romania, given that these interventions are built later and sometimes at the last minute.
- ◆ In 2011, a thought will be conducted within the membership network of Contact-2103 on the theme of life long learning, and this in parallel with an adhesion of Contact-2103 as member of the European platform EUCIS-LLL: looking for common stakes related to youth and to Long Life Learning. Production of report on this work. Transfer issues also observed and discussed in EUCIS-LLL to the all the interested members.
- ◆ Exchanges and discussions will focus in 2011 broadly on the themes of volunteerism, of the youth structured dialogue, on youth mobility in Europe, its impact, its quality and access to all public as well as cooperation between associations and public bodies. These discussions are intended to provide matters to each member organizations and enable them to make proposals at local, regional or national level on these topics. The tools will be the Internet, exchanges of materials, experiences and documents, meetings.
- ◆ An investigation will be initiated from Rotterdam and relying on the network of members on the topic of urban cultures and their development in other European member states.
- ◆ "IT'S YOUR RIGHT!" Organization of a campaign for schools on the topic of Human Rights and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and Youth. Romania.

6 Dissemination of information on Community action

- ◆ Organization and dissemination of information via the Internet. Its concerns information on network activities, testimonials, proposals or partners researches, calls for projects or developments of some European programs.
The mailing list of Contact-2103 contains over 2,000 addresses of members, partners, project promoters, sometimes themselves relays to other mailing lists - some of them are also Eurodesk relay
- ◆ Organization or co-organization by several member associations of information days on the youth mobility and community programs, particularly on YIAP: there are often associated to national agencies or regional correspondents.
For almost all member associations.

- ◆ Daily dissemination of information through our network of associations (regional federations, MJC, Youth House, Youth municipal projects, people relay etc..), officially recognized as youth information relays. For some of these associations is it a part of their mission to inform on one hand on local and national opportunities but also on the community level - they belong tools for this purpose often adapted by NA and by other institutions facilitating the implementation of actions for youth: mobility projects, humanitarian and international solidarity projects etc.
- ◆ Several member organizations have a specific role to inform on the European Voluntary Service, with for the majority of them recognition as sending organization.

- ◆ Several interventions are planned in 2011 in schools, higher education etc. about the opportunities offered by Europe in terms of mobility for young people.

- ◆ Edition of the magazine "Alandala" in Romania: information and debates on the EU agenda and the integration of Romania into Europe

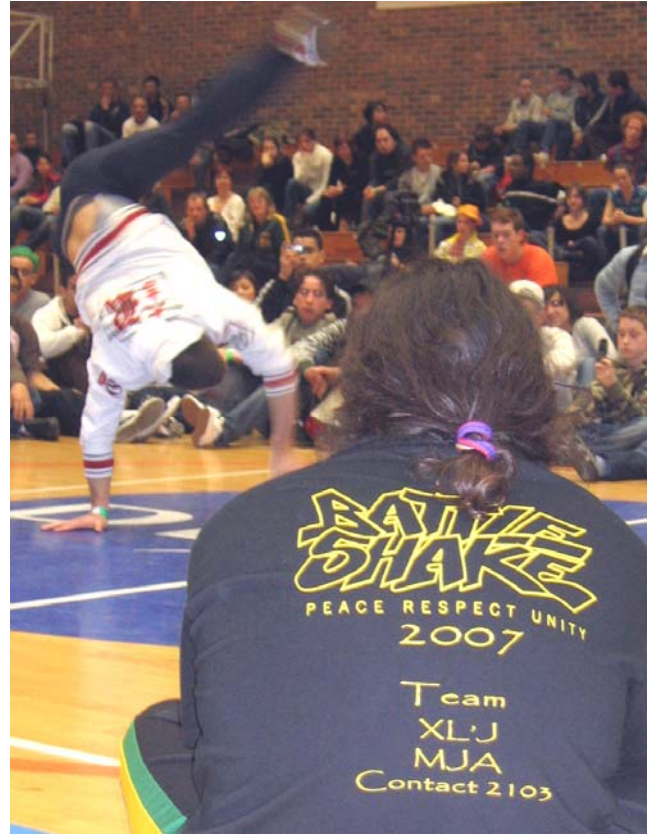

7 Actions promoting participation and initiative by young people

Generally most of the member associations of Contact-2103 and their affiliates give priority to the active citizenship of young people: management of associations, youth activities development based on "council of participation of young" aiming at promoting active youth participation in the association, in the municipality youth projects etc.. This focus allows the setting up into the network of a large number of local initiatives in which young people are actively involved.

- ◆ Ongoing in 2011 to support the development of youth initiatives and youth democracy projects into the YIAP. We expect in 2011 supporting a minimum of 8 youth national and transnational initiative projects and new "Youth Democracy" projects.
- ◆ In Italy, setting up of enterprise simulation course for the establishment of cooperative's projects and for projects of young entrepreneurs
- ◆ Two Youth clubs of Twin Towns (Lezignan and Lauterbach) will try to get into the establishment of a Youth Democracy Project.
- ◆ Many member associations have developed a web and computer activity where young people are actively involved. In addition there is more support and encouragement for young people to publish blogs to promote their activities or projects, like their European Voluntary Service.



- ◆ Participation of young volunteers hosted on the island of Chios in regattas for big yachts in the environment of the Greek islands. They take part in it symbolically on behalf of the colors of Europe and of the EVS and they realize so a good promotion of EVS.
- ◆ In Alsace, support of the development of a youth initiative project: creating an eco citizen festival that should be realized in June 2011.
- ◆ Gathering of 300 youth in Buzau for sports competitions on the theme of sport as an alternative option for leisure; a particular attention is carried to disabled youngsters.
- ◆ Portugal will prolong to local project "Buddy to Buddy", dynamic mixing youngsters with disabilities and social disadvantaged youngsters; a kind of support in tandem.



8 Other Activities

Activities or processes difficult to classify

- ◆ Strategy in the Action 4.6 of YIAP at Cordoba
Broad partnership between public entities and NGOs
The theme is the "Youth in Action Program" as a tool to facilitate youth employment
Three steps
 - * Seminar for leaders and youth workers around activities and tools up to be developed with the young
 - * Youth Exchange
 - * Seminar aiming at identifying good practices
- ◆ In Germany, participation in the project "Auswärts Zuhause" thinking action on the supply of existing accommodation for young people and particularly for young people in difficulties.
- ◆ Big gathering in Buzau for radio amateurs from 20 countries "UNIVERSE B90 -
- ◆ The Berufskolleg Ehrenfeld in Cologne will introduce a request-time recognition as a European school
- ◆ Follow-up at Brussels of the coordination of the project of social cohesion "Radis-Marolles" in the social housing, for all categories of ages. The project benefits of a regional recognition for 3 years.

Festivals

- ◆ ROCK FESTIVAL with 20 groups of 4 countries in Buzau
